od is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. ² Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, ³ though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling. Selah ⁴ There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. ⁵ God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns. ⁶ The nations rage, the kingdoms totter; He utters His voice, the earth melts. ⁷ The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress. Selah ⁸ Come, behold the works of the Lord, how He has brought desolations on the earth. ⁹ He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; He burns the chariots with fire. ¹⁰ "Be still, and know that I am God. NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

ow when some days had passed, Agrippa the king and Bernice arrived at Caesarea and greeted Festus. 14 And as they stayed there many days, Festus laid Paul's case before the king, saying, "There is a man left prisoner by Felix, 15 and when I was at Jerusalem, the chief priests and the elders of the Jews laid out their case against him, asking for a sentence of condemnation against him. ¹⁶ I answered them that it was not the custom of the Romans to give up anyone before the accused met the accusers face to face and had opportunity to make his defense concerning the charge laid against him. ¹⁷ So when they came together here, I made no delay, but on the next day took my seat on the tribunal and ordered the man to be brought. 18 When the accusers stood up, they brought no charge in his case of such evils as I supposed. 19 Rather they had certain points of dispute with him about their own religion and about a certain Jesus, who was dead, but whom Paul asserted to be alive. ²⁰ Being at a loss how to investigate these questions, I asked whether he wanted to go to Jerusalem and be tried there regarding them. ²¹ But when Paul had appealed to be kept in custody for the decision of the emperor, I ordered him to be held until I could send him to Caesar." ²² Then Agrippa said to Festus, "I would like to hear the man myself." "Tomorrow," said he, "you will hear him." ²³ So on the next day Agrippa and Bernice came with great pomp, and they entered the audience hall with the military tribunes and the prominent men of the city. Then, at the command of Festus, Paul was brought in. 24 And Festus said, "King Agrippa and all who are present with us, you see this man about whom the whole Jewish people petitioned me, both in Jerusalem and here, shouting that he ought not to live any longer. ²⁵ But I found that he had done nothing deserving death. And as he himself appealed to the emperor, I decided to go ahead and send him. ²⁶ But I have nothing definite to write to my lord about him. Therefore I have brought him before you all, and especially before you, King Agrippa, so that, after we have examined him, I may have something to write. 27 For it seems to me unreasonable, in sending a prisoner, not to indicate the charges against him." Acts 25:13-27 (ESV)

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

We especially bless You today for the great reformers of Your Church who call us back to the Gospel and to the righteousness we have in Christ alone. Keep us in fellowship with them, and bring us at last to our heavenly home and the joy of seeing our Redeemer face to face; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

A STEWARDSHIP NOTE

Due to our historical income and expenses, years ago Bethany reached a point where we no longer depend on pledge cards to estimate the next year's budget. Thus, the church council has opted to "forego" the usual pledge drive. GIVING OF YOUR OFFERING

If you find yourself using your checkbook less and less, consider these alternatives to your continued act of worship, service, trust, and sacrifice (i.e. "offering") to the Lord:

- 1. Bethany has contracted with a service called "Faithstreet".
 - a) From their website you can make a one-time-gift or set up a regular (weekly, monthly, etc.) offering. Look for a button like the one to the right of this paragraph on our church's website or Facebook page (www.BethanyLutheranPortOrchard.org) or www.facebook.com/Bethany.Kitsap).
 - b) Use Faithstreet to give by text: Save this # to "Bethany Offerings": **646-832-4848**. Send a text to that number with the amount you want to give as the content of the text. (i.e. "25", twenty-five dollars will be sent to Bethany.) You will receive a link asking for a quickcode. Enter "bethany" and finish this setup form. (You only have to do this once.) Next time simply text the amount to the number. Your gift will be processed immediately.
- 2. When you are doing your online banking, consider making your offering a part of your online bill pay (either by electronic transfer or by having your bank cut the check and send it to Bethany). This helps remedy the "forgetfulness factor."


